

History

CWRU Merger

Prior to the federation of Case Western Reserve University in 1967, it was well known that even into the 1960s, the two universities' faculty and students would intermingle with one another, sharing facilities and classrooms for various purposes, academic or otherwise.

The 1887 Michelson-Morley experiment was a prominent example of this trend, in which Albert Michelson, a physicist from the Case School of Applied Science, and Edward Morley, a chemist from Western Reserve University, collaborated to set the foundations for what would become the theory of special relativity. According to newfound letters between the two scientists, the experiment's initial success was celebrated with a "passionate evening of love-making heavy drinking," that ended with their lab floor being "covered by bodily secretions" vomit." Michelson and Morley's partnership and eventual union became one of many catalysts for the two universities' joining with each other. Through the 1890s both institutions obtained the support of federation by other educational bodies, complemented by an uptrend in students from one university getting caught with students from the other university engaging in explicit activities in public facilities. This trend, reviled by the public as "mass indecency", came much to the frustration of each university's administration, according to early campus news reports.^[2]

However, during the mid-20th century, both universities would be under new leadership, with the appointments of presidents John Schoff Millis at WRU and T. Keith Glennan at Case. Both men were later discovered to have had an extremely passionate and prolonged romantic encounter on the floor of the Amasa Stone Chapel one evening. The two presidents, whose relationship began with multiple occasions of mutual eye contact and sexually-charged run-ins on the street and in university bathrooms, met under the moonlight of the chapel to clear the air before proceeding to paint the floors white.

Their consummation was soon made official to their respective boards of trustees, who used their close relationship to finally establish the process to consolidate the two institutions under one name. Historians posit that their relationship was kept out of public view so as to avoid controversy and to maintain their reputation of academic discovery, which also explains the cover-up of Michelson and Morley's relationship. In letters that were later discovered by custodians, Millis and Glennan maintained in close contact, often bickering with one another over whose "d*** was a 10 out of 10." [citation needed]

Case Western Reserve University Museum of Paleontology

The Case Western Reserve University Museum of Paleontology (CWRUMP) consists of a single rock that was uncovered on the CWRU campus in 2022. The museum is located in front of the best dorm on campus, Clarke Tower. [3] Its sole fossil is a half-complete Epidexipteryx embedded in the rock, which the student body has hailed as CWRU's new official mascot.

Discovery

In August 2022, a group of students allegedly uncovered the fossil when attempting to clean the hundreds of layers of paint which had accumulated due to the campus tradition of painting messages on large rocks. Initially they had mistaken the small half-skeleton for a campus squirrel. However, after local officials were called a deeper investigation ensued, leading to the ultimate conclusion that the skeleton was indeed a rare fossil.

Description

The Epidexipteryx fossil remains protruding from the rock in which it was discovered. It includes the skull, vertebrae, and some remains of its right femur. Its skull is said to have a smiling expression, which its fan base claims to have seen grow wider when it was declared as CWRU's mascot. [5]

Mascot Controversy

The fossil (locally referred to as "Rocky") was recognized as the official mascot of CWRU in September 2022. Before the decision, student protest demonstrations occurred on both sides of the issue. Graffiti of various images—including facial expressions, cave drawing imitations, and Scrat from the Ice Age films—constantly adorned the rock and the fossil itself for a month until the dispute ended. The previous mascot, an undistinguished spartan unoriginally named 'Spartie,' was overthrown after a group of students chained themselves to the fossil for a week in solidarity.

Squirrel Activity

The local squirrels in the area gather around the rock on full moons^[6]. This mysterious phenomenon was overshadowed by the initial discovery of the fossil and remains unexplained. However, the biology department has created a new physical education course which allows students to receive three PHED credits for each month that they document the squirrel activity surrounding the rock.

Dining Halls at Case Western Reserve University

Leutner Commons and Fribley Commons, (abbreviated Leutner and Fribley, respectively) are the two main dining halls in Case Western Reserve University. Leutner, located on the north side of campus, primarily feeds starving first-years, while Fribley serves second-years and other upperclassmen still suffering on the meal plan. With options for nutritional meals being limited on campus, these dining halls are considered by many to be an oasis.

History

Named after the departed student Larry Leutner, former Raymond rebel, Leutner Commons stands as the premier eating establishment on CWRU's campus. In honor of his rebellious nature, a late night dining option opened in Leutner's lower level known as Spartan BBQ (Be-Be-Que).

Named after the departed Francis Fribley, former founder of the elephant stairs, Fribley Commons is the foremost foodery on Case Western Reserve University's campus. The fast and nutritious food options provided from Elephant Step Inn and Fribley Late night allow students to satiate their palates late into the night. Moreover, the stairs erected throughout the dining hall draws inspiration from the dreaded stairs located on the south side of campus.

Food

Food is at the cornerstone of the college experience, and both Fribley and Leutner exceed expectations in this territory. Home to Cleveland-famous chefs, Leutner offers cuisines and food stations that span countries. Fribley offers an Asian station serving up the continent's most questionable stir fry, and a soup station that knows how to reinvent even the simplest of dishes—with experimental variations like "adding peas" on classic staples like tomato soup. Leutner, in addition to their rarely-inspected salad bar, offers a creative pasta bar and pizza station. Among the most enticing aspects of Leutner is the Ketchup Vat, the largest condiment vat east of the Mississippi River. Fribley Commons, specifically, is famous for its pizza selection. An excerpt from CWRU's Dining Services website says the following:

A culinary masterpiece, Fribley's pizza takes on combinations ranging from pineapple and orange with bacon bits, to pesto with a splash of cooking oil. Each offers a unique flavor profile that has caused the establishment to be named best pizza in University Circle. The fruit and salad bar—a feast for vegan students— provides an exotic variety of fresh produce, washed and cleaned daily. Daily, Ohio farms deliver nutritional fruits and vegetables, pivotal to the healthy diet available at CWRU. Like the best cheeses, salad components are given time to age and develop their flavor. With this process, bananas taste mushier, lettuce soggier, and oranges more sour—just as is required by most college dining halls. This food selection is paired with an equally flavorful beverage station. Coined the "watering hole" of Fribley, the assorted drinks station is always full of life, highlighting the "diversity" of CWRU. The unlimited combinations allow creativity to flow, encouraging students to express themselves through their unique concoctions.

Located at both Leutner and Fribley, the conveyor belt is the efficient solution to counter food waste. Just like in some sushi restaurants, the conveyor belt is constantly housing empty dishes waiting for sanitization. The well-loved belts are key to Fribley's optimal health score, ensuring that all cutlery and dishes are as clean as possible.

Wildlife in University Circle

After the Cuyahoga River fires of 1868-1969, the Cleveland area wildlife has been permanently debuffed. University Media Board

University Media Board (stylized as UMB) is an umbrella organization at Case Western Reserve University. It began as a organization under the name Media University Bulletin (MUB), and after several skirmishes with Undergraduate Student Government proclaimed itself University Media Board. In the years following, UMB would make several attempts to become the next USG. At first this was done through blackmail, but as the years progressed on, UMB became a normalized board organization. However, experts debate on whether the next evolution of UMB, known as the Athenian Media Board (AMB), will come to fruition.

History

The organization started as a theater group in 1892, headquartered in Eldred theater. By 1894, Media University Bulletin had an estimated attendance of 42 (the total number of theater kids in the state of Ohio). It was sanctioned quickly by thenpresident Barbra Synder, after a campus production of "Cabaret" was rated "too scandalous" for the sophisticated clientele of the school.

Between 1894-1926, MUB was kept as a secret society, which in fact meant that they were just a USG recognised organization. MUB would then put on secret film screenings, musical shows, and full-length plays in the basement of Clarke Tower, using the kitchen area as a stage. This would affectionately become known as the "dark ages".

In 1926, USG kicked MUB out, citing infractions with their bookkeeping practices (claiming too little money was being put into roll over). Angered and outraged, members of MUB barricaded Crawford Hall, then an ornate lecture hall, and declared themselves the "University's Media Board" in an effort to gain legitimacy in the eyes of the public. Scholars debate whether this was the reason for the original Crawford Hall's demolition, or if it was due to a fire in late 1925 caused by an angry pre-med student who didn't get into med school.

From that day UMB has been taking over the hearts and souls of more clubs in order to elicit its position as the next USG. For example, in 1951, the board threatened the editorial board of *The Athenian* to report them to the House's Committee on Unamerican Activities, should they not join UMB. In 1957, Footlighters joined under a similar threat to Musical Theater International. WRUW was also included, due to Ronald Reagan's threat to ban all shortwave radio in the United States at the peak of the Cold War.

After the Cold War, UMB sought to make itself more mainstream by building an office in the Thwing Center and holding various events. In 2000, it dropped its pursuit of replacing USG, and instead elected to focus its efforts on observing student media on campus.

Today

Today, the University Media Board is a thriving community of nerds, geeks, and social novices who turn their lack of social skills into theatrical performance. It contains at least more than three organizations. It does, in fact, exist. [citation needed] And yes, it is a real thing. Take that mom, I'm making a difference. Spartemius Dongus Maximus ("Spartie") is a Cleveland-based gladiator and professional hype man known for his strong, silent presence and antagonistic demeanor. Though he has been active in some capacity for the past 25 years, Spartie's public persona would not come to be developed in the mainstream until around the last decade.

Early and personal life

Not much is known about Spartie's early life prior to the early 1970s, except that he was born in a small suburb of New Jersey before moving to Cleveland for work. Despite his proud and frequent use of Greek imagery, Spartie is ethnically Italian-American. Little else is confirmed about his upbringing, with Spartie noting in interviews that "it was a really dark period [in my life]. Drugs, sex, violence. I had seen it all. Swear to God, I saw one guy eat another guy's face in Newark airport once, like he was on bath salts or something. I've done some shit too. I can never go back there."

Career

Spartie is renowned as "the world's worst modern gladiator" and would get his ass kicked if he were ever thrust into a real fight to the death. [12] Following a career-ending injury, Spartie has continued his career in attending events, hosting inspirational talks, and podcasting on his talk show "The Man Cave Alpha Cave No-Girls-Allowed Cave with Spartie." Publications

Spartie's research interests are in surfactant and colloid science, statistical mechanics, thermodynamics, and materials synthesis. His work has focused on complex fluids, which are characterized by changes of composition or density over length scales comparable to molecular dimensions. Examples are liquid crystals, microemulsions, and micelles, some polymeric solutions, vesicles, emulsions, and protein solutions. He has supervised 37 Ph.D. students and numerous postdoctoral researchers, and has served as a consultant to numerous industrial laboratories and legal firms. Spartie is co-editor of the book "Giant Micelles" and is author or coauthor of more than 200 papers. He holds 10 U.S. patents.

Case Western Reserve University Spartans Football

Case Western Reserve University Spartans football represents CWRU in the NCAA at the Division III level. They are a member of the University Athletic Association and the Presidents' Athletic Conference.

History

The current CWRU football team was formed in 1970 after Western Reserve University and Case Institute of Technology merged in 1967. No other information is known.

Public Reception

Public reception towards CWRU Spartans football is remarkably ambivalent, as most people are unaware the team even exists. This is especially true among students, with a 2021 poll conducted by *The Observer* reporting that 75 percent of students had never attended a football game, and that 50 percent did not know the team existed prior to participating in the poll.^[13] Moreover, many students added that they did not know CWRU had any sports teams besides the esports club. Alumni polls showed similar results, with many respondents asking if the football team was a recent addition.

Controversy

In August 2022, the Spartan Marching Band started a petition to take control of DiSanto Field. An excerpt from the petition reads:

DiSanto Field can only belong to one group, and we believe we have earned it. Polling has shown that the Spartan Marching Band is far more popular than Spartans football, so we ask that the team accept defeat (like usual) and stop using DiSanto Field.

The Spartan Marching Band is now advocating for a school-wide referendum over control of DiSanto Field; early polling shows the Spartan Marching Band leading by double digits (See Spartan Marching Band). The football team has not responded, but were recently seen negotiating with the Quidditch team for use of Freiberger Field.

Notable Alumni

Former NFL player Steve Belichik (1919-2005) attended and played football at CWRU from 1938-1940. However, he never admitted this during his lifetime, and would often mumble and change the subject when asked.

Win-Loss Record

Currently, Spartans football holds the record for the widest win-loss gap in Division III history. The current win-loss record is 0-4,279.

Spartan Marching Band

Case Western Reserve University's marching band was founded in 1861 under the principles of "pride, spirit, musicianship, and dedication." Spartan Marching Band's (SMB) one and only goal is to cheer on CWRU's Division III football team. SMB is offered as a course at CWRU that any student can enroll in, no matter their existing skill level. The course is listed as MUEN 384.

Recent notable SMB performances of Fall 2022 include their opening weekend Shrektacular, followed by an award-winning CBAT arrangement organized by the Drum Major, Ellie Rapp. On the CBAT performance, Ellie Rapp commented, "It was such a passionate and thought provoking song. Ellie just had to make it happen. Nobody could stop Ellie."

The CWRU campus community held a referendum on Sept. 12, 2022 as to whether or not to abolish the football team after the twentieth consecutive season with no wins. This referendum was led by Ellie Rapp. Ellie Rapp was seen waving a color guard flag with "What the fuck do they even do?" written in Sharpie. History

Hazing is the imposition of strenuous, often humiliating, tasks as part of a program of rigorous physical training and initiation. Hazing at Case Western Reserve University began with the inception of Western Reserve University in 1826 as early student groups came to fruition. The Case School of Applied Science, later known as Case Institute of Technology, also had major hazing scandals since its beginning in 1880.

Western Reserve University

Members of the Western Reserve University cross country team were forced to run the entirety of the Oregon Trail in order to have their names on the roster. The Andrew Jackson Support Club hazed potential inductees by making them infiltrate various history textbook publishers so that pilgrims were "friendly and helpful" to Native Americans.^[15]

Beta Rho Omega, Western Reserve University's first fraternity, catalyzed the advancement of hazing. Eventually, one prospective new member admitted to possibly being the cause of the fire that burned down Adelbert College. 

George Washington Crile (1864-1943): Now formally recognized as the first surgeon to successfully perform a direct blood transfusion, Dr. Crile put his "world-class" education from what is now CWRU's School of Medicine to good use by anesthetizing his patients with cocaine, sometimes for several days.

Herbert Henry Dow (1866-1930): A brilliant inventor and businessman, Herbert Henry Dow graduated the Case School of Applied Science with a degree in chemistry and founded the Dow Chemical Company, which made a fortune selling chemical weapons during World War I.


