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

CWRU Spends More Money on Ugly Statues

CLEVELAND, Ohio – On Saturday the Vice President of Campus Beautification at Case Western Reserve University announced plans to unveil a set of new statues on campus. The ceremony for the unveiling will be the official start of a new program to beautify the campus over the next five years.

"The administration here at Case Western Reserve University is really thrilled to announce our plans to spend even more money to make our campus one of the best in the nation. Students and faculty can expect to see many changes to the scenery around CWRU over the next five years. We've already spent 10 million dollars on three new art pieces that we feel will really show people what CWRU is all about," announced Joanna Moss, VP of Campus Beautification, at Saturday's press conference. The three statues with the \$10 million price tag were purchased from artists in the Cleveland area. Details on the statues are being kept secret until the unveiling later next week, though a few minor hints about the statues have slipped out. "All the statues can be classified as modern art. We wanted them to complement the other statues around campus, as well as the fantastic architecture of the Peter B. Lewis building," stated Moss.

When asked to comment on their sculptures, two of the artists declined to comment. The third was willing to speak very candidly about his piece, though he spoke under the condition of anonymity. "See, these guys came up to my studio one day and said they wanted to commission a statue for their university. So I was like, whoa dude, awesome. 


New Vice President for Planning and Budget Named

Former New York Governor Eliot Spitzer was named as the new Vice President for Planning and Budget at Case Western Reserve University effective Wednesday April 9th, 2008. Spitzer has already outlined an in-depth plan on bringing Case out of the red. 


