#### Getting around at CWRU - Campus Perception of Bikes

#### Taylor Swift Cites GWAR as Inspiration

Rumors abound that country singer Taylor Swift has taken inspiration from heavy death metal band GWAR have been around almost as long as Taylor Swift has. In a press release earlier this month, Swift confirmed these rumors, stating that she drew heavily on inspiration from the early 90's metal band.

"Similarly, GWAR uses graphic descriptions of what's happening around them – 'Skulls are smashed, and bones are bending / joints are popping, claws are rending' – I used a similar method to establish Juliet's feelings of loneliness when Romeo doesn't call her for awhile, as well as to establish Juliet's love for Romeo earlier in the song. Of course, there are some occasions where being up front and simple is best – like where Juliet explicitly says that she feels lonely, and where GWAR proclaims in as many words that Gor-Gor is big."

Swift ways that she drew a lot of the content from GWAR's work as well. "Gor-Gor is literally a big, overwhelming figure in the

lives of GWAR. In Juliet's life, Romeo is a big, overwhelming figure, to the point where she cannot think of anything else."

"Additionally, in 'Love Story,' Juliet's dad clearly hates Romeo, repeatedly telling him to stay away from his daughter. At the end of the song, however, he finally accepts him and allows her to marry him. Gor-Gor is similar – he is described as someone whose coming causes sirens to wail and the military to respond. At song's end, GWAR states 'And now, my son / my bastard son / it is time we embrace / Gor-Gor!"

"Can't you see the resemblance between the two songs?" Swift reportedly asked her interviewers. This is a question which we here at the Athenian can confidently answer: no. The two songs clearly have nothing in common. The student body seems to disagree, however. Sophomore Adam Nichols said "It's always been obvious to me: she totally copied them."

Neither Gor-Gor nor any members of GWAR could be reached for a statement.

own self-interests, regardless of the feelings of others.




