

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

# Case Engineering Department Invents X-Ray Glasses

#### Jesus Christ Rejected From **Republican Nomination**



#### Prominent Public Figure Dies; Mourned by the 1%

Apathy rocked the world this past month at the announcement of a prominent death: that of general media mogul and noted curmudgeon Christopher Hitchens. Suffering from a combination of throat cancer and ill will, Hitchens died at 3:23 AM on December 15, 2011, an extremely inconvenient time, as the night nurses were just changing shifts and his demise caused a disruption. He appeared to have been wide awake when he expired, judging by the Sharpie in one withered hand and the defaced photograph of Reza Pahlavi in the other.

The history of such an illustrious man goes back many years. Born on April 13, 1949 in

Cordevonhamshire, England, Hitchens was a self-described "Übermisanthrope" who rejected all traditional styles of education (including but not limited to private ["public," in British parlance] school, boarding school, and homeschooling) in favor of isolated autodidactism and penning several treatises on the folly of personalized religion by the age of eleven (his most famous work, "Religion as Desexualization," can be found in college libraries worldwide). Fast-tracked through Oxford University by taking correspondence courses, he graduated at thirteen and thereafter devoted his life to condescending to everything and everybody.

However, his most famous contribution to society comes not from his hatred of people, but from his temporary abandonment of said trait. In 1979, Hitchens founded the International Church of the Atheists, in direct opposition to the Church of Christian Churchology,

which he deemed "utterly foolish and in need of a flat palm to the buttocks" (ref. "On the Origin of Stupidity," 1977). The church, which for deliberate irony was set up in a mosque basement, attracted approximately 5.48 million devotees (among them noted public figures Emeril LaGasse, Richard Astley, and David Ben-Gurion) before the Schism of 1996. In May of that year, the Council of Church Semi-elders voted by a two-thirds majority to excommunicate Hitchens, ostensibly due to a long-standing disagreement over the church's motto; rather than "There is no God," Hitchens constantly pushed for "There is no God, DAMMIT."

Senior church member J.C. Sires, when asked about Hitchens's effect on the church, admitted that "[he] really brought down the general attitude of the whole operation, and he clashed with our mission statement. No, seriously, he clashed. The man always wore gray." Sires claimed that Hitchens's constant negativity made too many people long for the "oblivious bliss" of organized religion, and that the disagreement over the motto was more of an excuse than a true reason to excommunicate.

Embittered by the excommunication, Hitchens spent the last fifteen years of his life sequestered, only leaving his man-cave to make the occasional public appearance near some religious function – in short, business as usual. His last treatise, "On Godwin's Law: Christianity as the Cause of Hitler's Insanity," was published approximately two months before he died. Uproar over the treatise continues to this day.

He is survived by an extremely forbearing wife of twenty-two years, three children, an ex-wife, and thirty-seven dark gray suits, the latter of which can be purchased for a nominal fee and come with a can of Rite Guard.



#### **Case Against Coke**

We at the Athenian have finally found the answer to a question that has perplexed the elders for generations - why is Coca-Cola so delicious? After three thousand weeks of research and approximately seventy six trillion cans of said beverage, something shocking has been discovered that colors Coke's past a dark, bubbly, unpleasant brown. 

# Congress's Approval of Americans Hits an All-Time Low

According to a new poll that came out earlier this week, Congress' approval of the American people is at an all time low. The poll suggests that only 11% of congresspeople approve their constituents.

"No matter how hard we work at our jobs, the American people constantly complain about it, and we're fed up with it," said John Boehner, the Republican Speaker of the House from Ohio. "Seriously, they want us to cut out the pork, but keep funding projects within their own districts. There's just no pleasing these people."

Since 2006, Congress' approval of the American people has been in steady decline. Until the most recent poll, Congress' lowest approval of the American people was at 14%, that number coming from a poll from August of 2011.

"Republicans and Democrats can't agree on anything, except that the American people completely suck at rating their congresspeople," said Geoff Geofferson, resident poll worker for the Corporate News Company.

The poll was conducted from a random sampling of 263 congresspeople. According to the data, 10% percent of Republicans, 16% of democrats, and 9% of independents approve of the general American public.

A separate poll conducted at the same time found that 48% of President Obama approves of the American people. "Obama's shoulders, torso, and thighs are solidly behind the American people, but the rest of his body can't stand them," said Corporate News Company political correspondent Steve Stevenson.


