



# **EECS Department Begins Taking Orders for Frank Gehry Ray Gun**

This week the Department of Electrical Engineering and Computer Science announced that they will begin taking preorders for their latest venture, the Frank Gehry Ray Gun. The device is claimed to implement the world's first method of transforming objects into their "Gehrified" equivalents, a process developed in the department's earlier paper "An Extrinsic Study of the Peter B. Lewis Building."

The ray gun, modeled after the similar device found in the Portal video games but with a bright pink glow, has been confirmed to both Gehrify objects and reverse its own effects. In an interview with Athenian staff, Schrödinger explained the device's military and industrial applications.

### Field Study: The Life Cycle of Muggers

As this undoubtedly unseasonable winter draws to a close, we of the Case Ornithological Society have been observing the cycling habits of a very strange bird indeed. On the order of the common pigeon (Columba livia) and the house sparrow (Passer domesticus), the common campus mugger (Homo turpis) typically exits his or her nest between late March and mid-May, after a long, hard winter of hibernation.

Congregating in groups of one to four, muggers build nests at the beginning of winter out of any sorts of materials they can find; their nests are usually made primarily of textbook pages and iMacs, with the latter serving as a sort of base upon which the muggers can rest their buttocks. Power cords of varying widths and lengths link the heaviest material into a mat known to ornithologists as a 'slum'; the rest of the nest is padded with torn underwear, used napkins, and cell phone parts to create a comfortable hibernation spot.

Muggers typically sleep in these nests from mid-December until the end of hibernation season. The process of emergence takes several days, during which time any passing student is in danger of having his or her loose belongings sucked into the void without any provocation. Afterwards, however, the mugger (or muggers, depending on the size of the cluster) emerges stronger than before, and more hazardous to campus health due to several months of showerless sleep.

Upon emergence, the mugger will take several more days to exchange his or her befouled winter clothes for a fresh hoodie of unknown origin, a pair of sweatpants, and a clean gun. This shedding of the winter skin is known as 'evasion' in ornithological circles. Similar items are often found missing from shops within a five-mile radius of the migrating muggers.

Mating season is also approaching; as such, we find it prudent to give a description of the mugger in heat, as the species is closely

related enough to humans (Homo sapiens) that mating attempts often take place. The mugger, whether male or female, will begin by flapping the bottom of his or her hoodie, releasing a foul odor that attracts members of their species. Mating then takes place posthaste, typically in a public area. Students are advised not to approach mating muggers, as they can be drawn into the mating ceremony and cannot be easily extricated.

The Case Ornithological Society has predicted that the campus community at large, due to this year's warm weather, will be overrun with a 10.98% increase in muggers next year.

### **CWRU to Enter Video Game Industry; Announces Three Titles**

Thanks to a sponsorship with gaming company juggernaut Activision, Case will start developing video games targeted at the Case Community. President Barbara Snyder had this to say: "We all know that Case is home to nerds who play video games all day, why not make some bank off that?" The first title in the Case Video Game Series, Case Cops on Duty, puts you in the exciting role of a Case police officer. The game is described as being a sandbox open-world experience defined by the limits of Case campus. As a Case police officer, you'll direct traffic, ride on a Segway, hand out parking tickets, engage in thrilling parkour as you chase down criminals, and beat them down with kung-fu.

"When we were creating Case Cops on Duty, we realized that letting the player shoot criminals would look bad. Therefore, we came up with an innovative parkour system that lets you maneuver around objects swiftly in order to chase the criminal down and bring them to justice," says game director Bernie Melts. "For each successful task a player completes, they gain experience and rank up. Some people say our game is like Call of Duty meets Shag Fu. I say, why not imitate success?" However, players won't be forced to stop crimes in progress. "Will you help or turn a blind eye and eat a sandwich instead? These are the kinds of moral dilemmas that Case cops face every day." The game is expected to ship with a robust multiplayer component that lets players play as criminals or cops. Cops are expected to guard wimpy college students who wander around by themselves as criminals try to beat them up and steal their change. The game will also have various side quests available. Expect party crashing mini-games and noise violation chases to keep the game exciting. Bernie also says that, just like in real life, Case cops will be able to talk to squirrels on campus in order to find out where crimes are actively occurring. The game is expected to ship with day one adownloadable content that lets you play as

the real Case crossing guard hero, Mark the Crossing Guard.

Crazy Greenie has been described as a thrilling driving simulator. As a Case greenie driver, you'll be timed as you pick up and drop off students with no regard to the actual bus schedule. You get bonus points for ignoring students in-between stops (just like in real life!) all while driving at the insane speed of twentyfive miles an hour. At this point, the greenie controls more like operating an aircraft carrier, but Melts said that was part of the real-life simulation. 
Arcade to comment on the issue, but we have been banned from their offices after attempting to exorcise demons from their computer.

On a completely unrelated note, if you want to help The Athenian out, any information about job openings would be greatly appreciated.




Below: Stephen Hawking being targeted by the inescapable quad laser,



### Springfest Headliner Tyga to Teach Guest Physics Lecture

Continuing Case's long tradition of inviting guest lecturers such as Snoop Dogg, Miley Cyrus, and Jon Huntsman, physics department chair Isaac Newton announced that this year's Springfest headliner, somewhat-acclaimed rapper Tyga, will be leading a Physics 122 lecture.


The lecture, covering electromagnetic waves, draws from Tyga's doctoral thesis, "An Examination of Transverse Wave Motion in Titties." Considered "groundbreaking" and "key to our understanding of femtosecond laser spectroscopy as we know it," by Pitchfork, Tyga's thesis is notable for both winning the IEEE Edison Medal and also debuting at number two on the Billboard Top 100 before holding number one for 16 weeks.

According to the music department, a group such as the Chicago Symphony Orchestra would be more appropriate for an audience made up of Case students.

Critics also include the global physics community, who referenced a 2008 paper highlighting inaccuracies and flaws in Tyga's thesis. The paper, seen by many as the first instance of a physics gang war, accuses Tyga of falsifying research data, especially that taken from the electron microscope installed in a Pittsburgh strip club. It also charges the physicist-rapper

### Republicans Combine Corporate and Fetal Personhood Bills

In political news today, Republican legislators at the federal and state levels have been pushing combined "personhood bills" to define both corporations and unborn children as legal "persons" and giving both equal rights.


On a positive note, defining corporations as "persons" would make them eligible for the death penalty.
